### In-line effluent screen

Stops those problem objects **before** they get to the irrigator nozzle

**Irrigator nozzles** often block with bits of hoof, ear tags, penicillin tubes, bottle tops and stones, washed from the yard.

You then have to go to the back of the farm to fix the problem.

*Why not trap the items just after the pump, close to the dairy, where it is quicker and easier to remove them?*

*(Note: Chopped silage, fibre or hay from feed pads can cause the screen to clog too quickly. Ask us about your particular application.)*



To clean this screen, you simply rotate the cap. The bayonet fitting automatically releases the cap and seal. Lift the cap off to reveal the **whole** screen..

The bar screen (with 13 mm gaps) pulls apart for easy cleaning and re-assembly. The gaps are 32 mm when the bars are separated.

The cap is replaced and given a quick turn to re-assemble the screen.

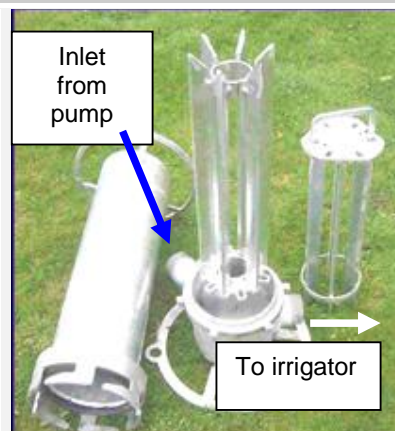
**No tools required!**

This simple device will remove about 99% of the problem items in the irrigated effluent.

Simple to open: simple to clean: simple to reseal.

The **only** maintenance needed is to keep a little lubricant on the rubber seal so that the cap may be removed and replaced with no effort.
